Research Interests:

My broad research interests include developmental social/health psychology with the aim of understanding the etiology of alcohol use disorders. Specifically I am interested in the development of temperament by emerging adulthood and how this impacts one’s drinking behaviors as well as other health protective behavior. My past work has paid particular attention to the indirect influences of parenting on drinking behavior through both internalizing (i.e. stress, depression, and neuroticism) and externalizing (i.e. impulsivity, poor behavioral control, sensation seeking, deviance) pathways to alcohol-related problems. My current focus is on the experimental study of the construct of impaired control over drinking and whether this mechanism to alcohol use disorder is due to cold or hot executive function deficits. My lab is studying impaired control with both state and trait measures of impulsivity or behavioral under-control. Other interests include factors that promote the developmental maturing out of alcohol-related behaviors. Additional interests include the scientific study of religiosity and measurement development projects concerning hostile impulsivity, contextual impaired control, emotional self-regulation, facets of self-concealment, and broad based resiliency over the lifetime.

Summary of Undergraduate Teaching Supervised Research

Each semester since fall of 2005, I have mentored independent research in the Social Health Research Group. Every semester there have been from 7 to 28 undergraduates working in my research group on topics regarding the etiology of alcohol use and problems in emerging adulthood. Specifically, we have been examining parental influences on internalizing and externalizing symptoms in the alcohol-related problems pathways among university students. We have also explored topics regarding using social influence tactics to instill healthy behavioral choices regarding safe sexually practices or refraining from the use of energy drinks and mixing those drinks with alcohol. Moreover, I have mentored several students, Lindsey Backer, Melissa

Callan, Mallery Kleeschultee, and Natalie Shanklin to undergraduate poster and presentation awards and the Undergraduate research conferences held annually at Missouri University of Science and Technology. Each of these students received a \$750 dollar cash award, and two also won additional \$250 dollar awards for the best bibliographies in the entire contest. More recently, I have been mentoring Arizona State University students and helping them present their findings at regional (WPA) and international (Research Society on Alcoholism) conferences off of my data. It is this love of mentoring students through the research process that pushes me to seek my own laboratory.

Summary of Graduate Student Supervised Research

I have served on two Social Psychology Ph.D. committees regarding the psychology of religion. Moreover, I am the chair of a master's thesis regarding the use of social influence tactics to discourage the use of energy drink consumption. Lindsey Backer and I have been examining gain and loss framed messages along with one-sided and two-sided arguments as well as cognitive load on how well individuals process our healthy message. Moreover, I am working closely with two graduate students and independent research projects. My project with Megan Johnson concerns using advanced structural equation modeling techniques to examine the role religiosity and right wing authoritarianism have on prejudice. My project with Robert Carlisle concerns parental influences on intrinsic religiosity and whether it is linked to feelings of stress and depression among college students. Furthermore, I have a long history of working with the graduate students who are students of my colleagues. Currently, I work very closely with Jennifer Filson Moses from the University of Minnesota regarding indirect influences of parental monitoring on alcohol-related problems for the last three years. Moreover, I have an excellent working relationship with a graduate student from the University of Washington, Jeremy Luk, who is now a post doc at UCSD who is taking a number of my original findings regarding parenting styles and bonds and extending these ideas and applying them to Asian populations in the Pacific Northwest. My collaborations with Jeremy Luk have already generated three manuscripts this year alone in addictions journals.
