Post-Doctoral Fellowship in Translational Prevention Science

The REACH Institute at the Arizona State University (ASU) announces a post doctoral fellowship in longitudinal analysis of developmental and prevention trial data. The data sets involve rich direct observation data of family and peer interactions, genotyping as well as random assignment to a family-based intervention called the Family Check-Up. Papers will focus on understanding relationship dynamics involved in the development of problem behavior (antisocial behavior, substance use) and emotional distress (anxiety, depression) in children and adolescents, as well as intervention effects. The successful applicant will become part of a scientific team with expertise in MPLUS modeling, Family Checkup intervention, implementation science, and measurement. Individualized mentorship and course work in advanced quantitative methods are available in the Department of Psychology at ASU. The position specifically involves data analysis, publishing scientific papers, grant writing, and mentoring of graduate students in data analysis and scientific writing. The position is full time, renewable yearly depending on funding. The position begins approximately as soon as possible, and requires completion of a Ph.D. in behavioral science by the time of appointment and experience in quantitative analyses.

Desired qualifications are in multivariate data analysis, scientific writing, and experience working in a collaborative research team. This position provides a bridge opportunity to becoming an independent research scientist in the area of family-centered prevention drug and alcohol abuse, psychopathology as well as health promotion.
