The Department of Psychology at Arizona State University invites applications for a tenure-track Assistant Professor with a focus in Quantitative Psychology beginning August 2017. Applicants at entry level or advanced Assistant level are encouraged to apply. The successful candidate will be expected to make scholarly contributions in quantitative psychology, mentor graduate students specializing in quantitative psychology, teach advanced courses in his/her specialty area of quantitative methods and contribute to teaching the core quantitative curriculum at both the graduate and undergraduate levels, and participate in service to the institution and profession as appropriate. The nationally-prominent Quantitative Psychology Program at ASU currently has five faculty, with a sixth joining in January, 2017, and 11 active doctoral students. Ongoing collaborations exist with substantive researchers within the Department of Psychology and with quantitative faculty across campus. It is anticipated that the successful candidate will join in such collaborations.

The requirements for this position include: (1) a Ph.D. in Quantitative Psychology or a closely related discipline by time of appointment; (2) evidence of scholarly contributions in quantitative psychology; and (3) a commitment to quality teaching at the graduate and undergraduate levels. Desired qualifications include: 1) a research focus in any area of measurement, research methods, or statistical modeling of psychology data, 2) evidence of quality teaching, 3) evidence of participation/collaboration with substantive researchers in psychology, and 2) demonstrated success meeting the needs of diverse student populations and/or reaching out to diverse communities.

Initial deadline for receipt of complete applications is **December 3, 2016**; if not filled, review of complete applications will continue every two weeks thereafter until the search is closed. A background check is required for employment.
